The Junior League of Nashville (JLN) is an organization of women whose mission is to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration, and training.

Affiliation

The Junior League of Nashville is a member of the Association of Junior Leagues International, Inc. (AJLI), and consistently ranks as one of the 15 largest Leagues internationally. There are 295 Junior Leagues with a collective membership of more than 125,000 women.

Milestones

1922: JLN is founded.

1923: Founded the Junior League Home for Crippled Children, which eventually became Vanderbilt Children's Hospital (now Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt).

Since **1970**, JLN has given nearly \$20 million to support programs at the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt.

JLN has been instrumental in launching more than 20 community projects, including:

- 1956: Dede Wallace Center (now Centerstone)
- 1987: OUR Kids
- 1996: Renewal House
- 2000: The Junior League of Nashville Children's Services at the downtown Nashville Public Library
- 2006: The Junior League Center for Advanced Maternal-Fetal Care
- 2012: Junior League Sickle Cell Disease and Asthma Program at Matthew Walker Comprehensive Health Center
- 2016: Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt Child Life program endowment
- 2016: All Booked Up childhood literacy initiative
- 2022: Endowed the JLN Directorship in Pediatric Rehabilitation for a Monroe Carell physician to lead and grow pediatric rehabilitation initiatives and family-centered care well into the future
